495 Express Lanes Northern Extension Project (495 NEXT)

- Approx. \$660 million, 2.5-mile extension of 495 Express Lanes from Dulles Corridor interchange to George Washington Memorial Parkway (GWMP) near the American Legion Bridge
- Public-private partnership project between VDOT and Transurban through 2087





495 Express Lanes Northern Extension Project Timeline







Widened Beltway & Bike-Pedestrian Trail Construction

Construction Activities

- Mid-2023: Relocate utilities
- Mid-2024: Perform grading, install drainage, construct retaining walls
- Late 2024 / Early 2025: Complete construction of new outside lanes
- Mid-2025: Complete installation of new noise walls
- Late 2025: Complete construction of new inside lanes and open new Express Lanes
- Early 2026: Complete new bike-pedestrian trail and new Scott's Run Nature Preserve parking lot
- Noise walls: Now approximately 50% removed
- Trees: Now approximately 95% cleared

Live Oak Drive Bridge Construction

Bridge will feature wider sidewalks and connect to new Bike-Pedestrian Trail

Construction Activities

- April 2023: Shifted portion of Live Oak Drive
- May 2023: Tree clearing on acquired VDOT right of way
- Summer / Fall 2023:
 - Relocate overhead and underground utilities
 - Drive piles for Live Oak Drive bridge over Beltway
 - Shift Live Oak Drive slightly west to enable Beltway construction
- 2024: Install replacement and new sound walls
- Spring 2025: Complete Live Oak Drive Bridge
- Spring / Summer 2025: Demolish old bridge

Georgetown Pike Bridge Construction

Bridge will feature wider sidewalks and connect to new Bike-Pedestrian Trail and new Scott's Run Nature Preserve parking lot

Construction Activities

- Summer 2023:
 - Complete installation of abutments
 - East abutment pile driving started June 5 (daytime)
 - West abutment pile driving in late Summer 2023
 - Relocate utilities and highway signage
- Late 2023 / Early 2024:
 - Complete girder erections (nighttime)
 - Install deck and other bridge components
 - Transfer traffic onto new bridge
- Late 2024 / Early 2025: Demolish old bridge

Old Dominion Drive Bridge Construction

Bridge will feature wider sidewalks and connect to new Bike-Pedestrian Trail

Construction Activities

- Mid / Late June 2023: Pile driving on east side of Beltway (day-time)
- Fall / Winter 2023 Early 2024:
 - Additional pile driving on both sides of Beltway
 - Install retaining wall and fill to match road elevation
- Fall / Winter 2024:
 - Mount girders (night-time)
 - Construct deck and other elements of bridge
 - Transfer traffic onto new bridge
- Fall 2025: Demolish old bridge

Lewinsville Road Bridge Sidewalk Construction

Replace 5-foot-wide sidewalks with 10-foot-wide sidewalks

Add New Bike-Pedestrian Path (Lewinsville Road is terminus)

Construction Activities

- March June 2023
 - Restripe roadway
 - Demolish old sidewalks (alternated to maintain pedestrian access)
 - Install new sidewalks






Maintenance Yard and Future Park at Balls Hill Road


Existing VDOT Maintenance Yard

- Existing yard being used for construction
- Fence adjusted to maximize working space
- Additional construction entrances installed to minimize impact on Cooper Middle School and traffic at GTP/Balls Hill Road



Future Fairfax County Park

- Will provide parking and trail connection to Scott's Run and new bike-pedestrian trail
- Park will open at the end of the project
- VDOT Maintenance Yard with privacy fence will be next to park







Design Noise Analysis Process

- Final noise analysis completed in April 2023
- Based on design plans and updated traffic:
 - Is the wall warranted?
 - Is the wall feasible?
 - Is the wall reasonable?
- Final noise study results and proposed noise wall locations available on 495NEXT.org
- If construction impacts an existing wall, a replacement wall will be provided
- For new walls, input is solicited from benefited property owners and renters (voting process)

Virginia's Transportation Management Plan

Goals

- Maintain mobility during construction
- Enhance public and worker safety
- Provide reliable information about construction zone

Elements

- Transit and Transportation Demand Management
 - New bus route(s) across American Legion Bridge
 - Support to carpools and vanpools
- Traffic Operations and Incident Management
- Local Network Operations and Traffic Analysis
- Communications and Outreach









What Neighbors Should Expect

Nighttime Work: Certain activities are unavoidably noisy and impactful, and must be performed during overnight hours

Lane Closures / Traffic Changes: Periodic traffic impacts on local roads are required to safely complete work
